PURPOSE

To establish an overall program which provides funding to private nonprofit corporations for the purchase of vehicles and related equipment that support the transportation needs of the elderly and the disabled.

POLICY

It is the policy of the department to provide private nonprofit corporations an opportunity to obtain federal funding through state administered grants. The Alaska Section 16(b)(2) Management Plan will provide procedural direction for the program.

The Management Plan is intended to facilitate both state management and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) oversight by documenting in a single reference manual the state's policies and procedures for administering the Section 16(b)(2) program. Its primary purposes are to serve as the basis for FTA state level management reviews of the program and to provide public information on the state's administration of the Section 16(b)(2) program. Because this program is subject to changes in federal regulations, this plan will be updated periodically. This program is intended to serve the interest of the many nonprofit corporations within the state that are involved in transporting the elderly and disabled.

Procedures may be found in the Alaska Section 16(b)(2) Management Plan. Copies of these procedures are available through Headquarters Plans, Programs and Budget.

AUTHORITY

Federal Transit Act Amendments of 1991 (Section 3021); Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964 (Section 16); 49 U.S.C. app. 1612 et seq.; AS 44.42.020(a)(6); letter dated February 21, 1976 from Governor Jay Hammond to Mr. Jerome Premo designating the department as the agency to manage the Section 16 program.

IMPLEMENTATION RESPONSIBILITY

Director, Plans, Programs and Budget; Manager, Surface Transportation Planning Section; Statewide Transit Coordinator; Regional Grant Administrators.
