Dear Alaska State Legislator:

Enclosed is the Alaska Marine Highway System (AMHS) Annual Financial Report for Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 (ended June 30, 2023) as required by AS 19.65.070.

During FY2023, Alaska Marine Highway System recorded \$39.7 million in operating revenues, an increase of \$8.4 million from FY2022. Operating expenditures totaled \$127.5 million, \$21.1 million more than FY2022. Alaska Marine Highway System port calls increased from 3,801 in FY2022 to 4,317 in FY2023. Service weeks provided by Alaska Marine Highway System also increased from 230.0 in FY2022 to 247.6 in FY2023.

The Alaska Marine Highway System faced some significant challenges and changes during FY2023. The Alaska Marine Highway System is continually finding innovative ways to meet the challenge of providing safe, efficient, reliable, and cost-effective transportation for the traveling public. We look forward to discussing these with you during the upcoming legislative session.

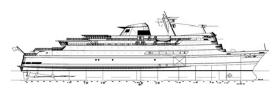

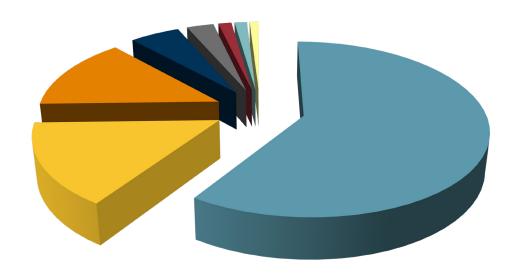

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT

#### Alaska Marine Highway System Fund Notes to the Financial Statement

For the Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2023

#### NOTE 1 - Alaska Marine Highway System Fund

The Alaska Marine Highway System Fund was established July 1, 1990. All gross revenues generated from the operation of the Alaska Marine Highway System are accounted for and remitted in accordance with AS 19.65.070 which mandates that the money shall be deposited in the Alaska Marine Highway System Fund.

#### **Marine Highway Capitalization Account**

The Marine Highway Capitalization account was established within the Alaska Marine Highway System Fund June 30, 2009. Access to this funding was restricted and only occured with approval by the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee.

#### NOTE 2 - <u>CIP Program Component</u>

The Alaska Marine Highway System budget includes a component which authorizes positions directly related to capital projects. Beginning in FY2001, the salary cost of time charged directly to capital projects is not recorded in the Alaska Marine Highway Fund. The cost of time charged to administration or overhead is recorded in the Alaska Marine Highway Fund.

#### NOTE 3 - Operating Overhaul

Overhaul expenditures that are included in the Operating Budget are limited to small maintenance items that arise while the vessels are operating and do not include capital overhaul expenditures. Large vessel overhaul and deferred maintenance items are included in the Capital Budget. In FY2023, \$20.0 million was appropriated for the annual Vessel Overhaul and Deferred Maintenance Capital Budget.

#### NOTE 4 - Calendar Year Budget

In the 2022 Session Law, Chapter 11 Alaska Marine Highways System budget was appropriationed from the general fund or other funds as set out in the fiscal year 2023 budget summary for the operating budget by funding source for the purposes expressed for the calendar year beginning January 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2023. Future year budgets will likely continue being appropriated on the calendar year basis for the Alaska Marine Highways System.

#### NOTE 5 - Fund Transfers

In CY2023, \$3.617 million was appropriated from the Motor Fuel Tax Fund to the Marine Highway Fund and the authority to use the funds is part of the Alaska Marine Highway System's CY2023 Operating Budget.
