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- Signed into law by President Obama on July 6, 2012
- Extended SAFETEA-LU through September 30, 2012
- New provisions effective October 1, 2012
- Authorizes programs for two years, through September 30, 2014



What MAP-21 Means for FTA Grantees

- · Steady and predictable funding
- · Consolidates certain transit programs to improve efficiency
- · New reporting requirements
- Requires performance measures for planning and safety



- Safety Authority (5329) FTA unfolding new requirements for all recipients
- State of Good Repair (5337) All transit agencies must develop their own asset management plan
- Public Transportation Emergency Relief (5324)
 - Assists States and public transportation systems with emergency-related expenses
 - Pays for protecting, repairing, or replacing equipment and facilities in danger of failing or which have suffered serious damage as a result of an emergency



- Bus and Bus Facilities Formula Grants (5339)
 - Provides capital funding to replace, rehabilitate, and purchase buses and related equipment, and to construct bus-related facilities
 - Replaces discretionary bus program
 - Alaska apportioned in FY13:
 - Anchorage \$525,554
 - Fairbanks \$76,274
 - Rural AK \$1,203,782





- Job Access and Reverse Commute formula (5316)
- New Freedom formula (5317)
- Paul S. Sarbanes Transit in the Parks discretionary (5320)



- Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities (5310)
 - Consolidates 5310 and 5317
 - Apportions to States and MPOs
 - Alaska apportioned for FY13:

Alaska Apportioned for FY13: Anchorage \$13,866,554 Fairbanks \$701,594

- Anchorage \$169,474
- Fairbanks \$65,572
- Rural AK \$157,364





- Metropolitan and Statewide Planning
 - Requires MPOs include transit agency officials in their governing structures
 - Requires states, transit agencies, and MPOs to establish performance targets; establishes a national performance measurement system



- Tier 2 25%, equally among tribes operating 200K or more vehicle revenue miles
 Tier 3 25%, among tribes with 1000 or more low income
